

Choosing a Moveable Mural for your Home

Adding a mural to your home is an excellent way for you to express yourself artistically as well as adding both value and beauty to your living environment.

It is a way of permanently altering the look of your home, and adding something to it which gives it uniqueness, all of its own.

There are times, however, when we may need to change our home or perhaps move the mural into a new area.

If you foresee this in your own situation, perhaps a moveable mural would be something that you could use.

Why moveable murals?

There are two basic types of movable murals that you can choose from. Either of these *can easily be removed from one area and put into another* but each of them has their own good points and bad points that need to be considered.

Regardless of which type of movable mural you choose, *it gives the artist the ability to work on their own schedule, in their own comfortable studio and to deliver the completed mural to you at one time.*



Mural on Plywood:

The most common type of movable mural is done on plywood and *may come in one or more different sections*. These sections can easily be added or removed from a room and they are typically attached with small nails so that they are a temporary fixture.

One of the benefits of using plywood in order to create your movable mural is that they are sturdy and not easily damaged. If you are thinking that you might have to store them for a considerable amount of time, however, you should understand that they can be difficult to store because of their size.

Mural on Canvas:

Another type of movable mural that you can choose is on canvas. Many people prefer to use this type of mural if there is a possibility that it is going to be staying at the same place for a long period of time.

Canvas is *best installed by a professional* who is used to handling this type of material; installation is similar to that of wallpaper. This type of mural should not be removed by the homeowner but it needs to be handled very carefully by a professional so that it is not damaged during the removal.

These murals are *extremely easy to store* as they can be rolled and put into a tube which does not take too much space in storage.

Regardless of whether you are moving from one home to another or if you are simply removing the mural from a child's bedroom whenever they outgrow the design, having the ability to move them without damaging the artwork is always preferred.

After all, it would only take a few moments for you to reinstall it in your new area and to take a little bit of your old home into your new home.
